COMMENTS:

Section 1- Excellent planning evident. The objective is clearly defined and you have targeted your group effectively. You have explicitly laid out the provisions for the session. Technology is used to ensure good delivery. You have a clearly defined goal for the session.

Outcome 1 – Very good identification of a range of target threat areas and justification for their inclusion (frequency, primary setting). Threats in the form of inappropriate material, social media and cyberbullying, threat of misuse of images and more are described and addressed. You have identified some of the more recognisable and popular platforms that children use to communicate and alerted parents to the modes of use.

Outcome 2 - Excellent advice. Sources clearly identified to parents. School has a robust and thorough attitude to E safety and has a wealth of information on the website. Aware of the major external bodies and school has a consistent approach for parents and students. Messages are well communicated to students via website. All staff have training in E safety, evidence of excellent support for students and parents.

Outcome 3 – You demonstrate a very considered approach to your systems and policies and you have provided a list of validated resources including PG online.

E safety is embedded in your schemes of work and students are effectively taught safeguarding techniques tailored to each key stage. You have considered your diverse audiences and the different learning and teaching styles. You have previously recommended expert resources from many of the leading charities but importantly, enable teachers to introduce and adapt materials to their own classes. The resources you have selected are the latest nationally recognised standards and are constantly being reviewed meaning that your school is always up to date with legislation. The intention to keep up to date is made clear through ongoing research and training.

Outcome 4 – You have shown the breadth of your research and your level of knowledge on sourcing and selecting safety information. Your internal systems are well researched and you have a clear approach to robust internet safety as a school. E safety policy is succinct and clear and the organisation is then clearly equipped with policies and procedures specifically designed for the area of safeguarding. It is pleasing to see that it is annually reviewed to show an ongoing commitment.

Outcome 5 – You are supporting the parents very well in this area. You have also provided a lively and vibrant session which raised awareness for parents and also clarified some of the issues that they were not aware of. The parents have gained new skills and they are actively aware of some of the features of social media and can better protect themselves and their children.

It is evident that the parents engaged with the activity and developed an understanding as a result of your work. An example is given in the fact that parents were empowered to use the technology and informed enough to open a dialogue about the issues raised.
