Susie Orbach

Susie Orbach is a British psychotherapist, psychoanalyst, writer and social critic. In her first book, Fat is a Feminist Issue, she examined the psychology of overeating and dieting in women. She has fought against the media pressure on young girls to be self-conscious about their appearance.

She is the author of thirteen books. Her book Bodies, won the Women in Psychology award for best book. She frequently contributes to the press and has published numerous papers. She wrote a column in The Guardian for ten years. She is the recipient of the first Lifetime Achievement Award for Psychoanalysis given by the British Psychoanalytical Society.

We are honoured to have Susie talk to our students and share her expertise. Our students had the opportunity to converse with Susie one-on-one and ask questions. She shed light on some of the struggles and obstacles in the 21st century. What a brilliant discussion!
