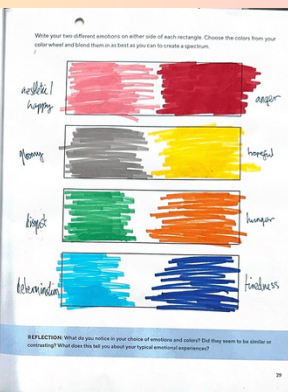
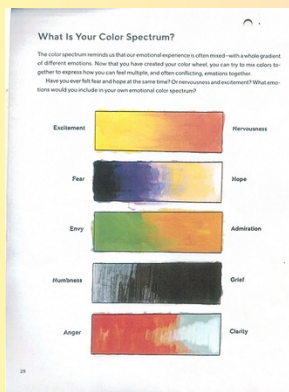
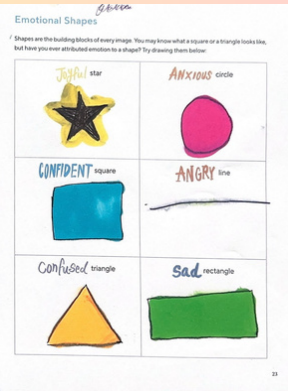
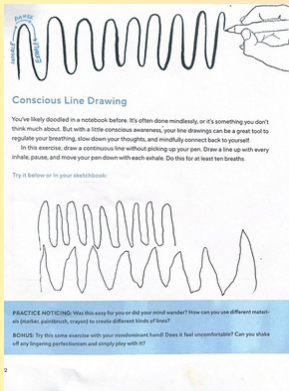




Wellbeing Club
