Disciplina – Instruction





What Is a UFP Pathway?

A University Foundation Programme (UFP) pathway is a subject-specific route designed to prepare students for entry into particular university courses. For example, students aiming to study engineering would follow the Engineering and Computing Pathway, which includes subjects such as Engineering, Mathematics, ICT, and Academic English. Similarly, those interested in business would take the Business and Finance Pathway, focusing on relevant skills and knowledge.

Each pathway is carefully tailored to meet the entry requirements of related degree programmes, ensuring students develop the appropriate expertise and confidence to succeed in their chosen field of study. Our dress code is designed to mirror the standards of professional or academic settings, encouraging students to cultivate habits that will serve them well in university and in their future careers.



General Expectations:

Students must wear attire that is suitable for a formal learning environment, suitable for formal, day-to-day professional settings.


- Formal wear is encouraged, such as tailored suits, smart trousers or skirts, and collared shirts.
- A formal jacket or blazer must be worn when moving around the building and during assemblies (this can be removed in class).
- Lanyards are provided, which must be visible at all times while on school premises.
- **Smart shoes** in dark leather (or equivalent) must be worn—no trainers or casual footwear.
- Hair must be kept neat and of a natural colour.

Clothing Guidelines:

- Trousers must be tailored and not tight-fitting.
- Shirts, blouses, or smart tops (boys' shirts must have collars).
- Skirts or dresses must be at or below knee length.
- **Jumpers** (crew, v-neck, or turtleneck) are acceptable when smart in appearance.

Jewellery, Makeup, and Accessories:

- Earrings should be small and lightweight.
- One discreet necklace or chain is permitted.
- Rings and bracelets should be **minimal** and non-distracting.
- Makeup must be subtle and professional.
- Nail varnish is permitted maximum of **two colours** only.
- Acrylic or false nails must not exceed 2cm in length.
- Synthetic eyelashes must appear natural.





Application Requirements







Academic Background

We welcome applications from students aged 16 or 17 who have completed Year 10 or Year 11 (or equivalent) in a recognised educational institution:

- English-medium schools
- Cambridge schools offering IGCSE qualifications
- IB schools
- Local state schools (including those delivering education in the national language)
- Any nationally accredited or private school recognised in the student's home country

IELTS for UKVI

To study at NLGS as an international student, you are required to demonstrate English proficiency by providing a valid IELTS for UKVI test result:

- A minimum score of 4.5 in each component (Listening, Reading, Writing, and Speaking).
- This is essential for eligibility under the UK student visa system.

Student Visas

All **international and EU students** (excluding Ireland) require a **Student Visa** to study in the UK.

Once your offer has been accepted and tuition fees paid in full, we will issue a **CAS** (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies) **letter** — a vital document required to complete your visa application.

What is a CAS Letter?

The Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) is an electronic document issued by NLGS once your place is confirmed. It is essential for your UK visa application.

The CAS letter includes:

- Your full name and personal details
- · Course title and duration
- Unique CAS number

Important:

You cannot apply for a student visa without a **CAS letter**.

The CAS accounts for 30 out of 40 points required to apply for a Tier 4 (G) **Student Visa.**

Our school bus service offers a safe and convenient transport solution for students.


While not a door-to-door service, the routes are carefully planned to serve a broad catchment area, and may change yearly based on demand and traffic, with updates announced at the start of each academic year.
